

AWA's Programs Directly Impact Our Community

AWA's **Vets on Wheels** works in targeted neighborhoods to deliver a variety of pet care services. Pet owners can get vaccinations, exams, as well as access to free or low cost spay/neuter surgeries for their pets. AWA staff is out in the neighborhoods each week talking to residents and giving away pet food.



During the last hour of our November *Camden Pet Care Day*, an older woman in a wheelchair arrived with her 13-year-old Akita named **Snowball**. Snowball had several noticeable health issues: hair loss and weakness when standing. The woman was unable to visit a veterinarian since she doesn't drive and can't transport Snowball on the bus or in a taxi. Due to her limitations, she was giving him human medications that were putting his poor health at even greater risk. We knew Snowball needed a more extensive examination so we arranged to transport Snowball to the Pet Clinic. We provided Snowball with appropriate

medications, vaccinations, and a special shampoo to make him more comfortable.



AWA's Clinic Works Hard to Help Pets Stay Healthy

Staff at our Pet Clinic are always busy with spay/neuter surgeries, vaccine clinics, wellness exams, workshops, and more. They are also busy helping animals in need, like Kayda. With nowhere to turn, the owner of Kayda, a 6-year-old presa canario with a large

tumor, contacted AWA. Crying, the owner said the tumor broke open and that Kayda could barely walk. We told her to "bring her dog right in." Our veterinarian examined her and determined that we could safely remove the tumor. Kayda was



immediately prepped for surgery and in under a hour, the massive ulcerated tumor was removed. Kayda felt so much better, she was able to walk out of AWA's clinic with her regular swagger! Her owner cried once more this time with happy tears!






Stories of Hope and Second Chances



Momma was hit by a car and found by the side of the road unable to move. Her companion, a younger dog, stayed with her until a caring person discovered them and brought them to a shelter. Because her pelvis was fractured, Momma, a sweet 2-year -old lab, needed surgery to heal properly and live a pain-free life. Thanks to our donors, Momma had the surgery and recovered in a foster home. Her foster mom decided she couldn't live without Momma and has made it her forever home!



Dougie was found with a rope embedded into his neck, malnourished and tested positive for heartworms. Now 30 pounds heavier, neck healed and heartworm free, Dougie is now enjoying his loving, forever home!







We assisted a local shelter overwhelmed with an intake of 120 cats from a hoarding case. **We accepted 12 ill cats and kittens** (some are pictured above.) All of the cats had upper respiratory infections and some were infested with fleas and mites. These cats who may not even have had names, were soon safe in the care of our veterinary team. Because of animal lovers like you, we were able to treat them with medication and spay/neuter them. After they healed and recuperated, we were able to give them the extra enrichment and behavioral work they needed to become more socialized and adoptable. Under the tender loving care of our staff, the cats started to come out of their shells and some have already been adopted!



During a snowstorm, we were here for pets like Hazel and Zoey. Their survival was in question when they were found out in the cold, safely captured and brought to AWA. We kept them safe and were able to save their lives!

Shiver was found in a box at a local Home Depot right before a snowstorm. Shiver is a senior dog with dental disease and mammary tumors. Thanks to our generous donors, we are working hard to give Shiver proper medical treatment so she can find the loving home she deserves.




