## FINANCIAL HEALTH

AWA continues to demonstrate a strong financial position, highlighted by notable increases in both program revenue and donations. The 10.8% growth in program revenue and an 8.2% rise in donations and fundraising reflect strong community support and engagement.

Although operational costs have risen by 4.28%, it is reassuring to note that a substantial 86% of expenses were allocated to life-saving programs. This commitment to mission-driven spending is essential for sustaining the organization's impact.

The annual wage increases designed to align with New Jersey's minimum wage are also a commendable initiative, as they help attract and retain skilled personnel, which is crucial for the organization's success.

Utilizing charitable bequests and investment income to balance the budget has been a strategic approach that ensures the sustainability of AWA's life-saving efforts.

### VETS ON WHEELS

AWA's Vets on Wheels (VOW) brings essential preventive care directly into the City of Camden, helping pets stay healthy and families stay together. By meeting pet owners where they are and easing transportation and financial challenges, VOW ensures that more neighbors can access the care their pets need and deserve.

Services for community members include: distemper, rabies, and Bordetella vaccinations; deworming; microchipping; and microchip checks.

### 5 ACRES SAVED FROM DEVELOPMENT

AWA's purchase on the five acres of undeveloped land next to our campus is a big win. Securing this adjacent property is a proactive step to protect the environment around the shelter and to plan wisely and strategically for the future. This land represents more than just open space. It's an investment in the well-being of our animals, our team, and the broader community AWA serves.

### AWA PUPPY PARTICIPATES IN PUPPY BOWL XXII

Finch, an irresistible shelter puppy, was selected to appear in **Puppy Bowl XXII**, with filming taking place in early October 2025. His participation helped shine a spotlight on shelter dogs everywhere and hopefully will inspire viewers to consider adoption when searching for their next companion.

## PET CLINIC

### DENTAL SERVICES FOR DOGS AT AWA

AWA is excited that dental care for dogs is now available in the Pet Clinic. Our team can provide routine dental procedures including oral examinations, radiographs, and surgical extractions if needed.

Dental care is a vital part of a dog's overall health. Without regular care, plaque and tartar can build up quickly, leading to painful gum disease, tooth loss, and infection. Routine dental checkups and cleanings help catch problems early, keeping dogs comfortable, pain-free, and able to enjoy everyday activities like eating, playing, and chewing their favorite toys.



### HELPING PETS IN CAMDEN

AWA brought Vets on Wheels to Subaru's Make a Dog's Day in the City of Camden on October 22, 2025. Through this community event AWA was able to provide basic preventative medical care to local pets, reinforcing a commitment to keep pets healthy and together with their families. 173 dogs vaccinated.

### A BENEFICIAL PARTNERSHIP

AWA is proud to partner with the Shreiber School of Veterinary Medicine at Rowan University to advance veterinary education while strengthening community animal welfare. This collaboration provides veterinary students with hands-on training in shelter medicine, allowing them to gain real-world experience caring for animals in a community setting. With the addition of the school's new mobile veterinary unit, the partnership also expands access to care for underserved pet populations across South Jersey. Rowan's Shreiber School of Veterinary Medicine, New Jersey's first veterinary school, shares this commitment through its focus on community engagement and management of PAWS Farm in Mount Laurel. Together, this partnership helps bridge the gap between academic training and the real-world needs of animals and families in the region.

## VOLUNTEERS: MAKING A DIFFERENCE

### HELPING HANDS AT AWA

Volunteers are the heart of AWA, making a meaningful difference in every corner of our organization. From dedicated individuals who care for animals in the shelter or in their homes as a foster, assist in our pet clinic, to corporate volunteer groups who bring energy, skills, and teamwork to special projects, events, and outreach efforts, their impact is felt every day.

## COMPASSIONATE KIDS

In 2025, we continued our impactful Compassionate Kids Program sponsored by Holman Enterprises. This reading initiative was designed to inspire kindness, confidence, and a love of learning in underserved communities. Partnering with youth organizations throughout the City of Camden and surrounding areas, the program provides humane-education themed storybooks, plush animals, backpacks, and essential school supplies to participating students. This program encourages children to read aloud to their pets, which is an activity shown to both calm animals and help young readers build confidence and strengthen their literacy skills.

## FALL STEM DAY AT AWA

On November 15th, we hosted our second annual Fall STEM Day at AWA. We welcomed students to our facility in two different groups separated by age. Our first group was for students in K - 5th grade, and our second group was for students in 6th - 12th grade. The students rotated to different stations throughout the shelter to learn about topics relating back to both STEM and animal welfare. STEM Day 2025 featured a Pet Nutrition station, a Vet Medicine station, an Engineering station, a Behavior and Training station, and, for the younger students, an Entomology station. Students were able to participate in activities like investigating parasites using microscopes, learning about safe and unsafe foods through a relay race, and playing a fun training game where they got to be both trainer and dog!

## A RARE DIAGNOSIS: A REMARKABLE RECOVERY

Twincie was an outgoing kitten who eagerly welcomed attention from the moment he arrived. Beneath his playful personality, however, was a serious medical challenge. He was diagnosed with a rare and complex condition called peritoneopericardial diaphragmatic hernia. In a healthy cat, the heart rests within a protective sac in the chest, separated from the abdomen by the diaphragm. In Twincie's case, that protective sac never developed, and his diaphragm was incomplete, allowing abdominal organs to shift into his chest cavity.

Despite the severity of his condition, Twincie showed no immediate signs of distress. Because he remained stable, AWA's medical team was able to carefully research surgical options, anticipate potential complications, and develop a thorough pain management plan. The surgery was successful, and Twincie's resilience quickly shone through—just two hours after the procedure, he was already interested in food. Though his recovery required strict cage rest and ongoing pain management, his fighting spirit never faded. It was a joyful moment when Twincie was finally ready to head home to his forever family.



**Madrid, an eight-year-old female cat, arrived at AWA in February of 2025. She was a little nervous in the busy cat condos, so she made herself comfortable in the Development office, where staff quickly fell in love with her gentle presence. After almost seven months of waiting, everyone was overjoyed when, she finally left with her new family.**



## AFTER THE FLOOD: A SECOND CHANCE FOR ROO

When natural disasters strike, pets and local shelters are often hit just as hard as the people in those communities. Following the July floods in Texas, shelters were overwhelmed with animals in need of safety and care. Thanks to the generosity of AWA's supporters, we were able to respond when help was urgently needed.

Through a coordinated rescue effort led by the BISSELL Pet Foundation, 100 displaced pets from Texas were transported to shelter partners across the country – including two that came to AWA.

When Roo (formerly Joop), a three-year-old terrier mix, arrived at AWA, he was suffering from demodectic mange, a non-contagious skin condition. Thanks to the attentive care of AWA's medical team, Roo received the treatment he needed to heal and thrive. Today, he's happily settled into his forever home with an AWA staff member who wanted to give this sweet boy the life he truly deserved.

## **A LONG WAIT: READY WHEN LOVE ARRIVED**

Waiting can be especially hard for an active young dog in a shelter. For nine months, Reeses Puppypups called AWA home, patiently hoping for a family of her own. Like many long-stay pets, the extended wait was stressful at times, but she never stopped trying.

With the help of AWA's dedicated Behavior team, Reeses Puppypups received the extra time, training, and enrichment she needed to build confidence and prepare for life beyond the shelter. Though she could be shy when meeting new people, once she felt safe, her sweet and gentle personality shined through. All she needed was someone willing to slow down and truly get to know her.

On December 3, 2025, that moment finally arrived, Reeses Puppypups' long-awaited gotcha day. Thanks to the support of compassionate donors, AWA is able to provide lifesaving care and individualized support for pets like Reeses Puppypups, ensuring they have everything they need while waiting for the families who will change their lives forever.



**Rae, an eleven-year-old dog, was surrendered by her family and struggled with the sudden change. After years in a loving home, the transition to a busy shelter was overwhelming. A foster placement proved to be exactly what she needed. Surrounded by patience and care, Rae began to blossom—and before long, her foster family realized they couldn't imagine life without her. They made her foster home her forever home.**



## **A DUCHESS: FINDS HER FOREVER PALACE**

Duchess, a beautiful snow-white cat with a gentle spirit, spent an astonishing 208 days at AWA. Though her stay was comfortable, with cozy napping spots and daily play sessions with staff, Duchess deserved more. She deserved to be someone's cherished companion. On August 8th, that dream finally came true. After more than half a year of waiting, Duchess found her perfect match and began her happily-ever-after.

Because of compassionate donors like you, Duchess's long stay was filled with love, care, and comfort until her forever family came along. While we'll miss her sweet face in the nursery, we couldn't be happier knowing she's finally where she belongs—home.


