You Helped Save Woodstock from the Brink of Death

Woodstock ran for days in the sweltering heat on his broken leg. Hungry, in pain and exhausted, he collapsed in an alley where he was found. It's hard to imagine his pain and suffering.

Woodstock was diagnosed with a broken femur in his right rear leg. In these cases, amputation is the best solution, but not for Woodstock He also had a torn ligament in his left rear knee which could never support his weight. We stabilized him with the proper nutrition but the only way to save him was through an immediate and complicated surgery followed by physical therapy and rehabilitation: a very expensive treatment plan for a small charity.

We asked you to help save him and you stepped up! With your help, Woodstock was able to get the

surgery he so desperately needed and live pain free.

Our vet partner, Mount Laurel Animal Hospital, released Woodstock after a successful surgery. He is now recovering in a foster home where he is kept comfortable and given lots of TLC. When he is able, Woodstock will begin rehabilitation.

In the meantime, Woodstock has been super affectionate and wellbehaved. One day he will make a loving addition to a forever family. We are so grateful for his second chance!

Dear Friends,

Making a positive impact in our community for animals and people is what AWA does. Often we forget to celebrate how far animal welfare has come. We look at the vast amount of life-saving work ahead and we keep moving.

How we save lives continues to change. Just a few years ago, we tested and tried new programs which are now recognized as standards of care and adopted by other shelters and rescues. Programs like: transport, serving pets in underserved communities, intensive neonatal fostercare, dog training for the public and adopters, pet retention & rehoming services,

TNR (trap, neuter, return) and behavior

rehabilitation.

The programs that AWA offers – paid for by supporters – have directly decreased the number of homeless pets, increased adoptions, and lowered euthanasia region wide! In addition, our community programs also make an impact:

- We have one of the largest programs for special-needs young adults. By providing opportunities to work and help animals, pets are helped and people are valued for their contribution;
- Over 100 kids attend an AWA humane education event in the summer.
 Kids make toys for the animals and learn about how to help outdoor cats. They learn they are part of the solution;
- Because of our limited space, hundreds of foster volunteers save lives each summer by opening their homes to provide care to baby kittens;
- Community awareness campaigns and workshops on topics like providing basic care to your aging pets, pet first aid, heat awareness, and free microchips to help keep pets safe.

AWA is truly "more than a shelter." AWA is a community resource. Your gifts make that happen.

Each month hundreds of animals leave to start anew in a loving home and each month hundreds of people take part in a program that helps animals directly and indirectly. We can't do it alone and the more inclusive we are the more animals are helped. Along with over 2,400 pets finding new loving homes, 1,200 shelter pets are medically treated so they can be adopted, 8,500 owned pets are spayed/neutered and 6,200 receive basic care and 3,130 receive specialty care at the Pet Clinic.

Your donations matter. The donations you provide do so much – feed the babies, keep the AC going in the summer, buy the pain medications for the injured and much more. Thank you for caring! Thank you for being a part of the AWA team!



Helping Heal Their Pain

When poor **Boop** came to AWA, we was limping on his front paw and barely able to walk. X-rays showed that Boop had a fracture. Was he hit be a car? Did he have a bad fall? We will



never know. Luckily he wasn't showing any signs of pain so our vets made a splint for him out of a spoon. After two weeks of careful observation, Boop's fracture healed and he was able to walk into the hearts of his new forever family.



It's hard to believe that someone would throw a four week old kitten out of a moving car, but that's exactly what happened to little **Geronimo**. When he came to AWA, he had an upper respiratory infection and was extremely frightened, but remarkably, sustained no injuries. Because of your gifts, we

were able to treat Geronimo with antibiotics and give him the extra TLC he needed to feel more secure. Thank you!

Staff at our **Pet Clinic** are always busy with spay/neuter surgeries, vaccine clinics, wellness exams, workshops, and more. They are busy helping pets like **Lola**. Lola is a very happy six month old pit bull brought to us by her owners. She had run into the street and was hit by a car. Fortunately she only had abrasions on both her hind legs and no broken bones. Lola's owners took her to their primary vet and had a full work up and had both legs bandaged. However, the cost of these services left them unable to afford the cost of the twice a week follow up care. With no where to turn, they came to AWA for help. Through our Helping Hands program, we cared for Lola's wounds until they healed. Her owners are so grateful to have her back to her old self!

Thanks to donors and support from **PetSmart Charities** and **The Camden County Board of Freeholders**, AWA continues to deliver a variety of pet care services to targeted Camden City neighborhoods. Through our **Vets on Wheels** program, pet owners can get exams and vaccinations, as well as access to free or low cost spay/neuter surgeries. AWA staff is out in the neighborhoods talking to residents and giving away pet food. This program helps keep their pets healthy and in their lives.



Five week old Whitney only weighed one pound and wouldn't eat or drink. Her owner was concerned that her life was in danger. Whitney was examined by one of our vets through our **Vets on Wheels** program. Whitney was given critical care prescription diet food which she gobbled right up. She came back weeks later for her vaccines and is thriving!



Donations from our Hope for Hops campaign helped us secure eight brand new bunny cages. AWA is the only

area shelter that houses and adopts out rabbits. Replacing our old, damaged cages was essential in providing quality care for hundreds of helpless rabbits. Thank you!
