Voorhees, NJ – The Animal Welfare Association's Vets on Wheels team received a very warm welcome from Cramer Hill (Camden City, NJ) residents on a very cold day. Over 60 residents came out to Von Neida Park on Wednesday, April 21st, 2021. The AWA team & volunteers stayed an extra two hours longer than the event's scheduled end time to be sure to see all 89 pets.

AWA's Vets on Wheels program provides Camden City residents with several free services for their pets thanks to AWA's partnership with Subaru of America. Services include a basic veterinary exam, pet vaccinations, flea & tick preventative, pet food, and microchips.

"It was great to be back out in Camden providing shots, microchips, and other services after nearly a year of sheltering in place due to Covid-19," says Maya Richmond, Executive Director of Animal Welfare Association. "Everyone's spirits remained positive despite our toes and fingers turning into icicles. Seeing so many loved pets and hearing some touching stories warmed our hearts."

There were at least a dozen kittens found by residents who took them in and have provided them safety and great care. One owner remembered visiting VOW three years ago and his fur-baby is now turning seven. AWA appreciated all of the Vets on Wheels clients who walked blocks, hopped in Ubers and braved the rain and frigid winds.
