## Homeless Pets YOU Saved: Lemonade, Chip, Tyson and MORE

#### When Life Gives You Lemons...

Lemonade, a four-year-old calico kitty, was rescued from a nearby shelter where she might not have made it out otherwise. Only cats aren't meant to be in cages...Lemonade did not thrive in the shelter environment, and instead pawed for hours at a time at the front of her cage to be let out. Luckily, a foster home had room for Lemonade, and she was one of 827 pets fostered in 2019.

Lemonade quickly sweetened to her foster home, but NOT the other cats there. It became clear Lemonade needed to be an only cat, or the "queen of the castle" as her foster mother put it. Months went by without the right home appearing, and AWA, thanks to your support, began extra-actively promoting Lemonade for adoption. A long-term volunteer, Carol M., came across one of the fliers promoting Lemonade, and fell in love with her beautiful eyes and outstretched paws. Carol's beloved cat had recently passed away, making her "castle" empty.

#### **Two-for-One Deal**

Chip, a one-year-old black lab, arrived from a Southern Transport and we noticed right away that something was wrong with his leg.

Chip could barely put weight on it as time went on, and it stuck out at an unusual angle. Our veterinarian determined that he would need his front left leg amputated, an expensive procedure that we did not anticipate when taking in Chip. As a result, we turned to our incredible AWA community, and people like YOU stepped up and generously "Chipped In" for his surgery.

The outpouring was so great, that not only were we able to amputate Chip's leg, but we were also able to help another dog, Tyson, who suffered from a similar injury.

Chip and Tyson, now living pain-free lives as tripods, were **both adopted by their foster moms**. The foster moms had seen them through their surgery, recovery, and helped Chip and Tyson get back on their feet!

Thanks to your support, in 2019 we spayed/neutered a FANTASTIC 4,988 pets a low/no cost to their people. Each of those pets will have a better life quality, longer life span, and the surgery halts their part in the overpopulation cycle. We are so appreciative for your role in making these victories happen!

Just as in its formation 50 years ago, spaying/neutering continues to be a top focus of the work YOU make possible through our pet clinic. With the can-do attitude of the clinic team, several general community spay/neuter days were held. In just two of these events, held in February, nearly 100 cats were "fixed" - many of them feral cats, who will no longer fear giving birth to unwanted litters of kittens.

While some of these events were supported by grant funding, others were made possible by donors like you.
